Objective/Audience

ABCs of the Form 990 is a “seat belt” course that will prepare participants for driving either the 2008 or 2009 versions of the Form 990 (as well as the Form 990-EZ). The course emphasizes the data to be secured and the inputs necessary to accurately and completely prepare the 990’s 11-page Core Form along with the Form’s most common Schedules. Along the way, common traps to avoid as well as nuances to understand in favor of easier preparation will be highlighted. Throughout the course, the emphasis is on the redesigned Form 990’s revamped definitions and new mandates for reporting on managers and their compensation, exempt program accomplishments, governance, and financial inputs and results.

Overall, the course covers:

- the entirety of the Form 990 “Core Form” (and the analogous parts of the Form 990-EZ), as well as the Core Form’s “12th page,” the Schedule O
- definitions used in reporting on “transactions with interested persons” for Schedule L
- how to report gross receipts and expenses in reporting on “fundraising events/sales” on Schedule G-Part II
- the use of Schedule A for identifying non-private foundation status and the use of Schedule C for reporting on the lobbying activities of 501(c)(3) organizations

- ascertaining the existence of and reporting obligations with respect to so-called “related organizations”
- the Form’s imperatives as well as key arenas where preparers’ common mistakes occur

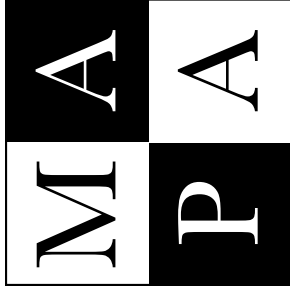
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
